

General Hospital School of Nursing Alumni Annual General Meeting Minutes

October 3, 2019 Holiday Inn St. John's

1. Welcome and Opening Remarks

Robert Meadus President, called the meeting to order and welcomed new and returning members. He drew attention to the 2019 GHSON Alumni Newsletter that were placed on the tables, indicating that the agenda, minutes and reports were all contained within the one document. He specifically highlighted the importance of the printed motion on the table regarding the movement of the scholarship funds.

2. Agenda

The agenda was accepted with no changes. Moved by Daphne Wallace and Seconded by Kathy Adey.

3. Moment of Silence in Recognition of Deceased Members

Jeanette Walsh read the names of the members who the Alumni were notified of that had passed away since the last annual meeting. A moment of silence was held in their honor. Sympathy cards were extended to all families on behalf of the Alumni by the Archive Volunteers. She reminded everyone of the value of letting us know ahead of time the names of anyone who passed away so that the information can be included in both the Newsletter and the memorial book. She also took a moment to acknowledge the passing of Doris Clark from the class of 1944b.

4. Class Roll Call

Bertha Schofield called the roll asking members present to stand when their year of graduation was announced. The roll call started at the year of 1945. 393 Alumni members were present in person which represented 45 different classes. This part of the business meeting was complemented by several classes singing tribute songs to recognize their reunion at tonight's event.

5. Presentations were provided to 60th anniversary year 1959, 50th anniversary year of 1969 and the 25TH anniversary year 1994. Both the class of 1969 and 1979 presented a donation to the GH Alumni in memory of their class and of deceased graduates. Classes celebrating other anniversary years were acknowledged and welcomed. Roses were provided to present members from the class of 1956 and before.

The President also publicly acknowledged the ongoing contributions of Susan Walsh, special event planner in ensuring the success of this year's event.

6. Scholarship Report

Kathy Adey the Vice president read the scholarship report. Two scholarships were awarded. One of the recipients were present and received their award in person and the respective GH Alumni family member received the award for the other. A summary on the winners' career and educational endeavors was included in the newsletter.

7. Minutes of 2018 AGM

The minutes were circulated in the GHSON Alumni Newsletter provided on all tables. The President asked if there were any errors or omissions. Hearing none the minutes were approved. Moved by Sharon Meehan and seconded by Mary Elaine Barrett.

- Business Arising There were no items raised.
- 9. New Business

The President's, Treasurer's and Alumni Office report were included in the newsletter distributed on the tables.

Robert presented the recommendation for the scholarship fund arising from the working group established at the 2018 AGM. Membership of the working group consisted of the current GH Alumni Executive plus four other volunteers; Jeanette Walsh, Bertha Schofield, Pam Baker and Merlee Steele-Rodway. The recommendation was to move the funds from the current GH Alumni bank account and internal review process to Memorial University of Newfoundland's Fund for Administration of scholarships, bursaries and awards. The motion presented included extra detail and was printed and put on all the tables. A copy is attached as Appendix A.

Questions were asked about the selection criteria in particular, would the requirement that the recipient was a family member of a GH Alumni remain. It was confirmed that if the motion was passed that we still would have control over setting the criteria and that the current requirements would be absolutely considered. However, it was noted that confirming relationships between scholarship applicants and GH Alumni relies on a lot of trust. Another question was asked about the communication with the membership on the award winners. It was confirmed that the names and bios of the award winners would still be read out each year at the Alumni dinner and the winners would be invited to attend, however the award itself would be passed out at the respective function within MUN's faculty of nursing event.

The president called for the vote on the motion. The motion passed.

A new motion was presented by Daphne Wallace and seconded by Trudy Bradbury. That the scholarship, bursary and award fund be expanded to include spouses, nieces, nephews, siblings, stepchildren children and grandchildren.

The President called for the vote on the motion. The motion was passed.

10. Election of Officers

Robert reported that there were no vacancies on the Executive as of the end of this annual meeting 2018. All current executive indicated their willingness to continue for the 2019-2020 year.

11. Adjournment

Robert thanked all the people who donated items for the silent auction and particularly mentioned the names of the Alumni members who donated the hooked rug and framed print that were up for ticket sales.

Motion: General Hospital School of Nursing (GHSON) Alumni

Whereas in 2014 the Executive of the GHSON Alumni was asked by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) why a large amount of funds was being held for a Non-Profit Organization. The CRA was given an explanation that the amount was necessary to establish a scholarship fund for perpetuity in the amount of 50-60,000 dollars. The goal to reach this amount of monies is evident in our audited year for 2019

And

Whereas the process for selecting award winners could benefit from an enhanced "selection" system offered by an organization that has expertise in scholarship selection best practices and has a wider outreach to potential applicants.

And

Whereas a Committee was struck from alumni members in October 2018 to review a process for a transfer of funds to an outside agency with the goal to establish scholarships in perpetuity for nursing students completing a nursing program in Newfoundland and Labrador (NL)

And

Whereas the Committee consisting of the executive plus four volunteers met four times during the year.

And

Whereas the Committee met with representatives from the Canadian Nurse Foundation and Memorial University of Newfoundland, Office of Development to assess the greatest benefits for sustaining the GHSON Alumni scholarship funds in perpetuity.

Be it resolved

that following these discussions, the Committee is recommending that the monies [\$50,000-60,000] be transferred to Memorial University of Newfoundland for creation of an Endowment Fund for Administration of Scholarships, Bursaries and Awards for Nursing Students. The

GHSON Alumni Committee members will develop the Scholarship Criteria. This decision from the Committee supports the legacy of the GHSON and the education of future NL Registered Nurses.
