Nurses join the Memorial Day Parade



Visitors

There were approx. 100 visitors. This number includes the class of 1975 which was celebrating its 40th year of graduation. On May 12th we hosted our first "Open House" in celebration of the birthday of Florence Nightingale. There were 20 visitors, most having visited for the first time. Among these were three nursing students from the Center for Nursing Studies, who were wearing the uniforms of 1910 of the General Hospital. These students visited hospitals and nursing homes under the guidance of Siobhainn Lewis.

As a matter of interest, two of our visitors were nurses from the United States who had previously visited the Florence Nightingale Museum in London, England and were more impressed by our Museum than that of the one in England, our display was much better.

Mary Southcott

In the year 2000 Miss Southcott was recognized by "The National Historic Sites of Canada" and as a follow up, a plaque will be cast and placed on site in the year 2006, to commemorate her contribution to our profession. The plaque will read as follows:

Mary Meager Southcott (1862-1943)

Mary Meager Southcott led the campaign to professionalize nursing in the early 20th-century Newfoundland. Trained in London, England, she founded the St. John's General Hospital School of Nursing in 1903, the only one of its kind in Newfoundland until 1929. As Superintendent of Nurses, she fought for recognition of her authority in the hospital and achieved her dream of a nurses' home. A prominent nursing leader and educator, Southcott helped to develop unique training programs for midwives, raised educational standards, and built a school worthy of the Nightingale System of Nursing.

Manning Award

On March 16th of this year The Historic Sites for Newfoundland and Labrador presented The Lillian Stevenson Nursing Archives and Museum with the citation that we had been selected to receive The Manning Award. This award is given to museums of provincial and local importance in our history. The ceremony was held at Hotel Nfld. and the presentation was made by His Honour the Lt. Governor, Mr Edward Roberts. This was followed by the presentation of a cheque for \$300.00 by Mr. Geoff Peters of the Historic sites and Monuments Board.

Pictures of Alumni Presidents

During the year we have had compiled a picture containing the Photograph of all Alumni presidents which is now located in the museum. Many thanks to Robert Thomas, the son in law of Maxine Taylor for making the copies.

Archival Collection

The archival collection was put on computer in the early 1990's with money from the National Archival organization. Since that time all recordings and pertinent information about graduates have been gathered, hand written and catalogued by Elizabeth Johnston and Kay Roche. Our photograph collection was also put on computer and up dated as well.

In May of this year we were successful in receiving money from H.R.D.C. which we used to hire a student with archival skills. He has listed the Alumni members on computer, in alphabetical order as well as graduation class dates. Photographs are ready for entry. Jeanette Walsh and Elizabeth Good have been assorting the collection of the School of Nursing Curriculum as changes evolved over the years.

Finally, 2006 will be the 80th anniversary of the Alumni as well as the 25th anniversary of the Archives Museum. So we have reason to celebrate.

Many thanks to the Alumni president and executive for their support during the year. Joanne was never sure of what she would be asked to do but she did it with dignity and warmth.
